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## **GUAM CONSOLIDATED COMMISSION ON UTILITIES RESOLUTION NO. 08-FY2017**

RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING GWA TO ISSUE AN INVITATION TO BID (ITB) TO PROCURE PROPERTY INSURANCE AND AUTHORIZING GWA TO PETITION THE GUAM PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL UNDER THE CONTRACT REVIEW PROTOCOL

WHEREAS, under 12 G.C.A. § 14105, the Consolidated Commission on Utilities ("CCU") has plenary authority over financial, contractual and policy matters relative to the Guam Waterworks Authority ("GWA"); and

WHEREAS, the Guam Waterworks Authority ("GWA") is a Guam Public Corporation established and existing under the laws of Guam; and

WHEREAS, under Section 6.06 (b) Insurance, of the 2005 General Indenture relative to GWA's Water and Wastewater System Revenue Bonds, GWA is required to maintain or cause to be maintained insurance on the "System" with responsible insurer in types and amounts that is usually maintained by prudent operators of systems similar and similarly situated to GWA's system; and

WHEREAS, "System" as defined in the Indenture means the water and sewer systems, now or hereafter existing, owned and or operated by the Authority or its' contractors, agents or subcontractors; and

WHEREAS, GWA currently maintains a five (5) year commercial property insurance policy (See ATTACHMENT "A") whose term will expire on 12:01 am, April 12, 2017; and

WHEREAS, under the current policy, the property covered, limits and perils insured against includes a \$30 million blanket on any one occurrence from direct physical loss to all real and personal property owned by GWA due to earthquakes and or typhoons; and

 WHEREAS, GWA management desires to procure similar commercial property insurance, adjusted for GWA's current state of condition, upon the expiration of the current policy in force; and

WHEREAS, based on past experience, GWA has found that a three (3) year and or five (5) years term is cost effective and beneficial to GWA; and

WHEREAS, based on GWA's best estimate, the IFB will exceed the General Manager's obligating authority of \$250,000 which is the purpose for GWA requesting the CCU's approval to issue the IFB; and

WHEREAS, the IFB is further subject to the Guam Public Utilities Commission under the Contract Review Protocol for Guam Waterworks Authority; and

NOW BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, the Consolidated Commission on Utilities does hereby approve and authorize the following:

- 1. The recitals set forth above hereby constitute the findings of the CCU.
- 2. The CCU finds that the issuance of an ITB for Property insurance to be prudent.
- 3. The CCU finds and agrees with the plan to solicit new insurance bids for a three (3) and or five (5) years term as cost effective and beneficial to GWA.
- 4. The approval authorized in Section 2, is subject to GWA obtaining the approval of the PUC under the Contract Review Protocol, accordingly, the General Manager is authorized to petition the PUCs' approval.
- 5. The General Manager is authorized to execute all documents and undertake all reasonable actions necessary to issue an Invitation to Bid procurement for commercial property insurance.

**RESOLVED**, that the Chairman certified and the Board Secretary attests to the adoption of this Resolution.

## SECTION III: BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF SOLICITATION

The Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA), a Guam public corporation, is the civilian monopoly supplier of water and wastewater services to the Island of Guam. GWA operates and maintains about 200 fresh water facilities on Guam providing service to a population of over 157,000 people. It also owns 87 wastewater facilities which are operated and maintained by a private contractor. The Authority has not insured its properties since its inception. The current bond indenture requires purchase of Property insurance. GWA is hereby inviting bids for insurance contracts (policies) for fourteen (14) month term.

## SECTION IV: INSTRUCTIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR BIDDERS:

#### 1. BID SCHEDULE.

The deadline for the submission of bids is August 31, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. Five copies of all responsive materials <u>must be received</u> (not postmarked) at GWA's Procurement Division located at the warehouse at GWA's Upper Tumon location (behind GTA) not later than the above date and hour. It is advisable to use courier services to expedite delivery of your bid, as Guam is served by several such courier services. It is bidder's responsibility to insure the bid is received as required above. Late bids will not be considered.

#### 2. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS.

Envelopes containing Bids shall be sealed and marked on the face with the name and address of the Bidder, the Bid Number and the time and date of submission. Telegraphic Bids will not be considered, nor will modifications by telegraph of Bids already submitted be considered. Bids must be received at the place of opening on or before the opening date and time. Bids received through the mail will not be accepted if such mail is received at the address showing after the submission date and time. Facsimile or e-mailed bids will not be accepted. Bids will be opened publicly.

All submittals must strictly conform to the Invitation for Bid and any addenda, non-responsive and non-responsible bids will not be considered.

Five (5) copies of each Bid, consisting of technical and commercial sections, must be submitted including all addenda, if any. Any and all sample documentation, including but not limited to, a complete proposed insurance policy, including exclusions, must be submitted. No submittal shall be considered complete unless accompanied by all items specified in this bid.

The IFB <u>must</u> be submitted on or before August 31, 2010 at 10:00 a.m. in a sealed envelope with the IFB number clearly marked and delivered to or addressed as follows:

Guam Waterworks Authority Attn: Vincent Guererro (or designee) 578 North Marine Corps Drive Tamuning, GU 96913 Examination of IFB Document: Bidders shall examine the IFB Documents to inform themselves of all conditions and requirements for the execution of the proposed work. Ignorance on the part of Bidder of any part of the IFB will in no way relieve him/her of the obligation and responsibility assumed under the Contract.

Familiarity with Laws: Bidder is assumed to be familiar with Federal and Local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that in any manner affect the work. Ignorance on the part of Bidder of any part of the IFB will in no way relieve him/her of the obligation and responsibility assumed under the Contract.

#### 3. EXPLANATION TO BIDDERS

No oral explanation in regard to the meaning of the specification will be made and no oral instructions will be given before the award of the Bid. Questions regarding discrepancies, omissions, or doubts as to the meaning of the specifications must be communicated in writing (either e-mail, fax or mail) to Guam Waterworks Authority for interpretation. Bidder should act promptly and allow sufficient time for a reply to reach them before the submission of their Bids. Interpretation, if required, shall be made in the form of an amendment to the specifications, which will be forwarded to all prospective bidders, and its receipt by the Bidder should be acknowledged on the Bid form.

#### 4. <u>CLARIFICATION ON INVITATION FOR BID</u>

Each Bidder must carefully examine the IFB and all amendments or addenda. If any Bidder (a) finds any discrepancies, omission or ambiguities in the IFB documents, (b) is uncertain as to the intent or meaning of any provision of the IFB, or (c) has any question regarding the IFB, the Bidder must promptly notify GWA in writing no later than five (5) working days prior to the closing date of the IFB thereof in writing at the address specified for submission of Bid. Replies to such notices may be made in the form of addenda, which will be issued simultaneously to all prospective Bidder's.

#### 5. <u>FORM</u>.

All bids must be in writing and submitted in a sealed envelope, and must be signed by an officer of the bidder having authority to submit such Bids. The bids should respond in an organized fashion to all requirements of this Invitation for Bidding.

## MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS.

Bids may be modified or withdrawn prior to submittal date. Any bid withdrawal, or modification received at GWA after the due date is late and, as such, renders the underlying bid in compliance only as to that which is on hand at the submittal date and hour.

#### 7. RECORDING BIDS.

Bids (and requests for bid modifications) shall be submitted to GWA officials on or before August 31, 2010 at 10:00 a.m. at the GWA Procurement Office.

Bidders shall be responsible for insuring its bid is <u>received</u> on or before the due date. Any late bid will not be considered by GWA. After the due date, a Register of Bids shall be prepared which shall include for all initial bids the name of each bidder, the number of modifications received, if any, and an indication of the coverage proposed, i.e. coverage of all risks or perils (a) as requested by GWA, (b) less than GWA request, and/or (c) alternate coverage as requested.

#### 8. <u>CONFIDENTIAL DATA.</u>

Bidders should clearly and specifically designate which portion or portions of the bid contains trade secrets or other proprietary data they propose be kept confidential. GWA shall examine the request and make a determination as to each request. Unclear requests or requests that do not specifically identify the exact portion of the bid which the bidder is requesting to be kept confidential shall not be considered. Guam law shall govern the determination of confidentiality of any document or portion thereof.

#### 9. AWARD.

Award shall be made to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

## CANCELLATION OF INVITATION; DELAYS.

GWA reserves the right to cancel or to withdraw this Invitation for Bids, to delay determination on this Invitation for Bid, or to reject all bids, in whole or in part, at any time prior to final award. The reasons for the cancellation, delay or rejection shall be made a part of the procurement file and shall be available for public inspection.

## 11. <u>INSPECTION OF GWA PROPERTIES.</u>

Prospective bidders may inspect GWA property to be covered by the insurance in connection with submitting a bid upon request (although such inspections shall occur not later than August 17, 2010). GWA shall be given at least 72 hours advance notice of any request to inspect. No inspection shall occur within 10 days prior to the due date of the bid. GWA will provide a representative to conduct the inspections. Please contact Vince Guerrero, Guam Procurement Administrator at (671) 647-7835 if you desire to inspect GWA facilities.

#### 12. REQUIRED APPROVALS:

A Notice to Award and Proceed are conditioned on GWA obtaining the approval of the, the Guam Consolidated Commission on Utilities and the Public Utilities Commission on Guam.

## 13. REPRESENTATION REGARDING GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS.

The bidder or contractor represents that it has not violated, is not violating, and promises that it will not violate the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks as mandated under the Guam Procurement Regulations. All Bidders shall submit an affidavit indicating that no gratuities or kickbacks have been given or made in connection with the submission of this bid.

## 14. REPRESENTATION REGARDING CONTINGENT FEES.

The Contractor will provide a certification to GWA in the form supplied with this bid indicating that it has not retained a person to solicit or secure a territorial contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies for the purpose of securing business.

#### 15. BID BOND.

All bidders shall submit to GWA a bid bond in a stated dollar amount which comprises 15% of the total bid amount. All bid bonds shall be in a form approved by GWA. Forms of security include: (1) a cashiers check made out to GWA; (2) an irrevocable letter of credit issued via a lender with offices on Guam and which can be redeemed on Guam; or (3) a bid bond issued by a surety licensed on Guam in a form acceptable to GWA capable of being presentment on Guam. Bidders with unaccepted bids will have bid bonds returned with written notices of rejection. Bid bonds will be returned in an expeditious manner following the award of the bid to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

#### 16. POLICY BINDER.

The provider who is awarded the contract will be required to provide the Authority with a policy binder with the complete policies and endorsements within 10 days from the date the Notice to Proceed is received by the Bidder.

#### 17. <u>ADDENDA TO IFB.</u>

In the event it becomes necessary to revise any part of this IFB, addenda will be provided to all Bidder's who received the basic IFB. Any addenda issued pursuant to this IFB must be acknowledged as being received by the Bidder.

#### 18. <u>AFFIDAVIT OF DISCLOSURE</u>.

Affidavit of Disclosure of Major Shareholders - must comply with the following requirements and failure to submit an affidavit shall be basis for rejection.

- (a) Bidder must use form issued by Guam Waterworks Authority
- (b) The affidavit must be notarized and dated on the same month as the bid opening and must valid for the 12 months preceding the submission of the bid.
- (c) Date signature of the person authorized to sign the bid and the notary date must be the same.
- (d) First time affidavit must be an original \_ if copy; indicate Bid Number/Agency where original can be obtained.

## **SECTION V: GENERAL INSURANCE SPECIFICATIONS**

- 1. The Bid must include all of the following:
  - a. Term premiums for the required coverage.
  - b. Complete specimen policy form(s) and endorsements.
  - c. Information on the claims reporting procedures to be used by each insurance carrier.
  - d. Details of a deferred premium payment plan. The rate of interest or finance charges, if any, must be fully disclosed and included in the bid prices.
  - e. Completed Brokers Questionnaire.

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- 2. The Authority will not consider the purchase of insurance from any insurance carrier not rated at least A- or higher by A. M. Best, or equivalent. Carriers with lower ratings may apply for consideration if adequately reinsured.
- 3. The Authority will not consider the purchase of insurance arranged by an individual or entity not licensed as an insurance Agent, Broker, or Surplus Lines Broker in accordance with Guam law (22 G.C.A., Division 2, Insurance Law.)
  - The coverages, to the extent practical, should be placed with one carrier. GWA reserves the sole right to determine the acceptability of such a plan. Acceptability will be evaluated as to its overall economic results which include premium (cost), condition, relative reliability of underlying carrier(s) and ability (to include among other things, track record, experience with other assured, personnel to be assigned to the account, experience and training) to service the account for claims, provide safety/loss control services, and otherwise. The above suggests one multiform carrier but does not exclude several carriers.
- 4. <u>Bid Format</u>. Bidders are free to submit their bids in a convenient format, however, at a minimum; the bids should provide sufficient financial, operational and other details sufficient for GWA to understand fully the nature of the bid. However, all bidders must submit include specimen policies and endorsements they intend to use.
  - Bidder shall supply all information requested by GWA concerning the bidder's responsibility. GWA may request additional data or information for the purposes of clarification at any time prior to award. Bidders failing to submit a complete bid package may be deemed to non-responsible.
- Rating Data. Prospective bidders requiring additional rating data should address their inquiry
  to the Procurement Officer. Replies with significant data will be furnished to all persons who,
  of record, have this Invitation For Bid.

## SECTION VI. EVALUATION OF BIDS.

In evaluating the bids, including the capacity of the bidder to perform, GWA will consider which bid provides the best value for insurance coverage. All costs must be included in the overall bid. GWA reserves the sole right to determine the acceptability and ranking of bids in any respect in order to provide GWA with the best overall value. In the bid evaluation process, the following factors may be considered:

- (a) Extent of hidden costs;
- (b) Whether the bidder meets the announced requirements of GWA in all material respects;
- (c) Cost of total package;
- (d) Terms of proposed insurance policy and contract;
- (e) Overall clarity and presentation of Bid;
- (f) Ability to provide the requisite services required herein;
- (g) Possess the requisite financial strength;
- (h) a satisfactory record of performance;
- (i) a satisfactory record of integrity;
- (j) qualified legally to contract with GWA; and
- (k) supplied all necessary information in connection with their Bid.

#### 4. LOSSES

Other than typhoon damage to water storage tanks, the Authority has no record of what would be considered as insurable losses to its property – there have been some structural failures as a result of age and lack of maintenance. The following typhoon damage has been recorded:

The Ugum tank is a 2 million gallon steel tank, built in 1991. The roof, or crown, was deformed and internal bracing fractured during Super Typhoon Pongsona in 2002. The tank sustained about \$411,000 damage but was not taken out of service.

The Mangilao tanks are two interconnected 1.5 million gallon units. One tank was out of service and believed to be empty at the time of loss, the other was torn from its foundation and had to be replaced; total cost \$1,930,000.

#### 5. RISK CONTROL

GWA owns 34 water tanks which are in various states of repair. Thirteen of these tanks have been examined and are considered to be in insurable condition, the remainder are in need of structural repairs. An inspection and renovation program has been initiated that will result in the tanks being brought up to American Water Works Association Standard D100-05. This work will be completed and the tanks added to the schedule of insured assets subject to availability of funds.

#### 7. REQUIRED CONDITIONS

#### a. Cancellation Clause

If Underwriters desire to cancel this policy other than for non-payment of premium, they shall give not less than ninety (90) days prior written notice by fax and Certified Mail to the GWA General Manager and GWA's Risk Manager designated below (or any other risk manager designated by GWA):

#### b. Premium Payment Clause

Unless otherwise agreed by endorsement, It is a condition of this policy that the premiums due must be paid to and received by Insurers 50% on or before midnight on each December 1st and 50% on each January 14th following each policy anniversary. If this condition is not complied with, this policy shall terminate on either of the above dates with the Insured hereby agreeing to pay premium calculated at not less than pro rata temporis.

#### c. Errors & Omissions Clause

The Insured shall not be prejudiced by an unintentional or inadvertent error, omission, incorrect valuation or incorrect description of the interest, risk or property; provided that notice is given to Underwriters as soon as practical after discovery of any such error or omission.

#### d. Schedules

The schedules of Property included with these Specifications represent, to the best of the Insured's knowledge, a complete listing of the property it wishes to insure and the current replacement values thereof. The schedules are not to be used to establish sub-limits of coverage, nor are they to be considered as any form of valuation. The amount payable under this Policy shall not be limited by individual values shown on the schedules.

#### e. Valuation

Recovery shall be made on the basis of one hundred percent (100%) of the property's current replacement value at the time and place of loss, subject to the limit of coverage provided by the Policy. The Insured shall not be required to rebuild or replace damaged or destroyed property on the same site nor with like kind and quality.

#### f. Permission to Add or Delete Property

Permission is granted to add or delete property during the term of the policy. Newly acquired property shall be automatically covered from the date of acquisition until the next policy anniversary. The additional premium for such property, and the return premium for property deleted from coverage, will be determined at each policy anniversary by audit adjustment. The policy anniversary is agreed to occur at 12.01 AM Local Time each 1st October.

#### g. Business Interruption and Extra Expense Extension

Coverage is extended to include the Actual Loss sustained by the Insured resulting directly from Interruption of Business for a period not to exceed twenty-four (24) calendar months.

Coverage is extended to include the necessary Extra Expense incurred by the Insured in order to continue as nearly as practicable the normal conduct of the Insured's business following loss or damage to property insured by this Policy.

## h. Demolition Cost and Increased Time to Rebuild

The cost of demolishing any undamaged portion of the building(s) covered, including the cost of clearing the site caused by loss from any insured peril and resulting from enforcement of any state or municipal law or ordinance regulating the construction or repair of buildings. Underwriters will also be liable for loss due to the additional period of time required for repair or reconstruction, in conformity with the minimum standard of such law or ordinance.

#### i. Increased Cost of Construction

The amount of insurance includes within the sum insured the actual amount of the increased costs of repair, rebuilding or construction resulting from the enforcements of any applicable law or ordinance regulating the construction or repair of buildings.

#### j. Denial of Access by Civil Authority

This Policy is extended to cover the actual loss sustained during the period of insurance against, access to real or personal property is impaired in whole or in part due the necessity to comply with Building and other Regulations under or framed in pursuance of any act in force at time of loss of any Public Authority.

## k. Waiver of Coinsurance or Average Clause

In the event of loss, there shall be no application of a coinsurance or average clause in determining the recovery due the Insured.

### m. Waiver of Subrogation - Tenants

In event of loss, Underwriters waive their rights of subrogation against any tenant occupying, renting or leasing property from the Insured.

## n. Underground Piping Damage/Sink Hole Restoration

In the event of loss or damage to underground piping, recovery shall be made on the basis of the actual costs to repair or replace the damaged piping and connected hardware plus an additional amount, not to exceed \$500,000, to replace soil and paving removed by action of water or other fluids discharged from the damaged pipe.

#### o. Damage to Building Exterior

Any endorsement or clause that excludes coverage for loss or damage to paint or waterproofing material applied to the exterior of a Building or other property, applied to the exterior surface of the Building or property shall be waived.

#### p. Damage to Building Interior

Any endorsement or clause that excludes coverage for damage to the inside of a Building or property in the Building caused by rain, sand, or dust unless wind first damages the roof or wall and enters through the resulting opening shall be waived.

#### q. Earthquake Damage to Buildings

Any endorsement or clause that limits coverage to damage that weakens the structural frame or therefore the stability of the life of the Building or structure shall be waived.

Any endorsement or clause that excludes loss for plaster cracks between masonry and gypsum board and any other deterioration of cement or plaster, as well as any damage caused by shrinkage, settling, deterioration and/or wear and tear shall be waived.

#### r. Jurisdiction

This insurance shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Guam and the exclusive jurisdiction Guam's courts. The seat of arbitration, if any, shall be Guam.

#### s. Service of Suit Clause

To be determined.

#### 8. DEFINITIONS & NOTES

- a. Booster Pumps are defined as the pump, powering motors, electrical panels, transformers, and switches, the pump base, enclosing structures, fences, and any other related equipment of every kind and description. Booster Pumps are located above ground in concrete enclosures also housing generator rooms.
- b. Water Wells are defined as the well casing, the well head, air release valves, check valves, by-pass valves, flow meters, chemical injection units, the pump, powering motors, electrical panels, transformers, and switches, enclosing structures, fences, and any other related equipment of every kind and description. Water wells are considered to be 90% below ground, 10% above; i.e. valves, meters, etc.
- c. Manholes are defined as the frame, cover, ladder components, cones, the barrel, bench and any other related equipment of every kind and description. Manhole covers and frames are at grade level, but do not extend above ground.
- d. Treatment Plants are defined as pumps, basins, control centers, ancillary buildings, fencing, transformers, electrical panels, power generating facilities, and any other related equipment of every kind and description.
- e. Storage Tanks are defined as the tank, its base, retaining rings and clips, lighting, ladders, pumps, their powering motors, transformers, gages, valves, back flow preventers, fences, and any other associated equipment of every kind and description.
