RESOLUTION NO. 2017–01

RESOLUTION RELATIVE TO THE APPROVAL OF ENGINEERING.

PROCUREMENT AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT (EPCM) CONTRACT

WHEREAS, in March 2015 the CCU authorized GPA to petition the PUC for approval of

Consulting Services for implementing USEPA Compliance Plan and use of \$750,000 of the 2014

WHEREAS, in May 2015 the PUC deferred its approval of the consulting services petition

pending its approval of GPA's proposal for 180MW of new Combined Cycle Power Plant²; and

WHEREAS, on August 31, 2015 GPA experienced catastrophic failure at the Cabras 3&4

Power Plant and caused generation capacity reserve shortfalls to support scheduled maintenance

outages for the Cabras 1&2 and MEC baseload power plants. This required GPA to acquire 40

MW of temporary power, establish an Interruptible Load Program, and initiate the repowering of

WHEREAS, in October 2015 the PUC considered the impact of the loss of the Cabras 3&4

Power Plant and need for additional generation reserve and, to further support GPA's request for

third party condition assessment of the Cabras 1&2 Power Plant and customer rate impact of new

Management Program and to evaluate additional renewables into the GPA generation plan³; and

WHEREAS, in July 2016 GPA completed its response to the October 2015 PUC Order

180MW of new generation capacity, required GPA to provide additional information such as a

capacity. In addition, the PUC set conditions required GPA to initiate the Demand Side

which included a Life Assessment study of the Cabras 1&2, an expanded Demand Side

Management program, a Time of Use Study, Customer Rate Impact summary, updated IRP

- 2 Plant, as well as an update to renewable integration with regards to Phase II, the lease of Navy
- 3 properties for solar photovoltaic (PV) development and the evaluation of energy storage for
- 4 increased PV penetration; and
- WHEREAS, in October 2016, the PUC approved GPA's petition for up to 180MW of new
- 6 generation capacity subject to the PUC procurement protocol and other conditions set forth in the
- 7 order. In addition, the PUC also approved the consulting services and funding to support the
- 8 procurement development for a IPP contract for new generation capacity; and
- 9 WHEREAS, on November 10, 2016 GPA issued RFP-17-001 for Engineering, Procurement
- and Construction Management Contract (EPCM) for the procurement development of an IPP
- 11 contract for new generation capacity and to represent GPA as Owner's engineer support in the
- 12 construction of the new power plant; and
- 13 WHEREAS, proposals were received on December 19, 2016 and Stanley Consultants, Inc.
- was determined to be the most qualified firm; and
- WHEREAS, GPA has proposed a compliance plan to USEPA for the Cabras 1&2 and MEC
- 16 Power Plants presently non-compliant with USEPA emissions regulations, specifically the EGU
- 17 MATS and the RICE MACT. The plan commits GPA to complying by 2021 which would
- include the fuel conversion to ultra-low sulfur diesel for MEC and retirement of Cabras 1&2
- 19 units after the commissioning of new units; and
- WHEREAS, GPA will task Stanley Consultants, Inc. for the procurement development to
- 21 meet our compliance plan commitment; and
- WHEREAS, GPA has acquired initial funding of \$750,000 as approved by the PUC in
- 23 October 2016 to support procurement development which exceeds the General Manager
- 24 authority; and
- 25 WHEREAS, GPA will update and obtain additional approvals for additional tasks under the
- 26 EPCM contract as required.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the CONSOLIDATED COMMISSION
- 28 ON UTILITIES, the GOVERNING BODY of the GUAM POWER AUTHORITY
- 29 HEREBY APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE AS FOLLOWS:

1	1. The CCU authorizes the GPA General Manager to contract with Stanley Consultants,
