**Comments on Bill No. 193-36 (COR)**

The proposed legislation intends to amend §24102 of Chapter 24, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, relative to exempting establishments that harvest and sell honey and honeycomb, and adding not-for-profit organizations that provide assistance to agricultural producers, from mandated sanitary permit requirements.

Should this proposed legislation pass, not for profit organizations, that work with local farmers and establishments that locally harvest and sell honey and honeycomb, shall be exempt from sanitary permit requirements.

The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Division of Environmental Health (DEH) administers new and renewal applications for Sanitary Permits for all health-regulated establishments. Pursuant to existing law, all Sanitary Permits expire June 30th of every year. The Sanitary Permit fee ranges from \$220 to \$290.00 or more depending on the number of employees.

As illustrated above, there may be a slight fiscal impact to the DPHSS, resulting from the exemption of Sanitary Permits for establishments that harvest and sell honey and honeycomb and not for profit organizations that provide assistance to agricultural producers. However, absent pertinent information from DPHSS, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate fiscal impact at this time.
