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GPA RESOLUTION NO: FY2022-20

**AUTHORIZING MANAGEMENT OF THE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY TO ENTER
TO A MONTH-TO-MONTH EXTENSION FOR ITS PROFESSIONAL PRINTING,
MAILING, PROCESSING AND OTHER SERVICES DUE TO ONGOING
PROCUREMENT APPEAL**

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2016, the Guam Power Authority (GPA) entered into a contract with Graphic Center, Inc. to provide professional printing, mailing and processing services of approximately 50,000 electric power billings each month; and

WHEREAS, the original contract became effective on April 18, 2016 for a one (1) year period from the date of award of the contract with the option to extend the contract for four (4) additional one-year periods; and

WHEREAS, GPA has exercised its base and options years of the contract and GPA had issued an Invitation for Bid (IFB) for these services but the bidder did not meet the bid requirements which necessitated a re-bid; and

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2021, the Consolidated Commission on Utilities authorized the management of GPA to exercise month-to-month services up to eight (8) months or when a new contract is awarded whichever comes first; and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2021, GPA issued Request for Proposal No. GPA-RFP-21-002 for the Re-Solicitation of Professional Printing, Mailing and Processing Services Relating to Utility Customer Billing; and

1 **WHEREAS**, on June 7, 2021, bids were received from three vendors and one was rejected
2 due to not meeting the required information. On August 18, 2021, GPA notified Graphic Center
3 that InfoSend was selected as the best qualified offeror and notified Moonlight BPO that its
4 proposal was disqualified and rejected; and

6 **WHEREAS**, on August 30, 2021, Graphic Center filed an agency-level protest. In their
7 protest, Graphic Center disputed the evaluation scores given to them and InfoSend. On October
8 7, 2021, GPA denied Graphic Center's protest; and

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10 **WHEREAS**, on October 22, 2021, Graphic Center filed a procurement appeal with the
11 Office of Public Accountability (OPA) and alleged that InfoSend's absence of a demonstrated
12 record and development system cannot score higher on the evaluation criteria when compared to
13 Graphic Center's demonstrated record of service to GPA for five years; and

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15 **WHEREAS**, on March 25, 2022, the OPA ruled its Decision denying Graphic Center's
16 appeal. Parties had a right to appeal the Public Auditor's Decision to the Superior Court of Guam
17 within fourteen (14) days after receipt of a Final Administrative Decision; and

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19 **WHEREAS**, on April 5, 2022, Graphic Center filed an appeal of the Public Auditor's
20 Decision to the Superior Court of Guam; and

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22 **WHEREAS**, GPA must have the printing services in order to issue monthly billings which
23 is the revenue lifeline of GPA; and

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25 **WHEREAS**, in April 2021, the CCU approved GPA's initial extension request of month-
26 to-month service up to eight months of the current contract or until an award is made via
27 Resolution 2021-10; and

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29 **WHEREAS**, GPA again seeks a month-to-month extension for approximately \$300,000
30 up to when a new contract is awarded and implemented in the event a new vendor is selected; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the total cost of the first base year and the option to exercise the extension of
2 four (4) additional one-year periods, plus the month-to-month extensions are estimated to be
3 \$2,200,000.00; and
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5 **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Consolidated Commission on
6 Utilities, subject to the review and approval of the Guam Public Utilities Commission as follows;
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
- 8 1. The General Manager is authorized to exercise month-to-month service up to when a
9 new contract is awarded and implemented in the event a new vendor is selected.
